Wrap Around Provision

We are thrilled to be offering our own wrap around provision at our school starting in August and details are as follows:

Breakfast Club will run from 07:45 until 08:45am and will continue to be led by Mrs Gill or Miss Arckless. Children arriving prior to 8:30am will be offered a breakfast selection of cereal, fruit, toast and a drink. The cost is £3.50 per day. We appreciate that this is quite a significant rise from the nominal cost morning club has been. However, we had held off reviewing the cost until we made the changes to our provision which is now starting earlier and offering breakfast and the cost is still competitive and in line with many other local schools charges.

After School Club


After School Club will be available from the first day back. It will run from 3:15 until 5:30pm each day and will be led by a new member of staff. The emphasis of this club is on play and leisure rather than education, however children will have the opportunity to complete any homework as well. Children will have the opportunity to enhance their learning through a wide variety of activities, including those that promote their physical development as well as an opportunity to wind down at the end of the school day. This club will also offer some half termly theme clubs on some days to complement the continuing extra-curricular offer. However, please note that our extra-curricular offer will be for typically 3-4 days a week from August with after school club available on the other days should your child wish to attend. The club will be booked in advance but may also have some limited on the day availability. The cost for after school club is:

3:15-4:15pm £5 per day to include a piece of fruit and a drink

4:15-5:30pm £6 per day to include a light tea served at 4:30pm

So 3:15- 5:30pm is £11 per day to include fruit, a drink and a light tea.

Details of how to book and pay, and activities on offer as well as our operating procedures will be shared with you in the week before the autumn term starts. We are also in the process of setting up the ability to pay using Childcare vouchers and the government tax-free childcare scheme.
